Digital cameras are not only easy to use, but their quality has improved relentlessly over the last decade to the point that their performance equals that of film cameras. Affordable inkjet printers can produce realistic long-lasting prints, although their relatively high running costs mean that many photographers choose to have their printing done by the high street photo processing labs.

Often it's safe to leave a modern camera set to "automatic". It means the photographer can concentrate on the composition of the image, rather than the machinery doing the taking. Successful photos rarely happen by accident, but through the thoughtful positioning of the "wanted" objects in the frame, and the exclusion of unwanted ones. It's why someone with a modest camera but a good eye will make better pictures than a technical expert with less visual awareness.

Joining our camera club will bring you together with like-minded people, so you can share your images and learn from others.

Our first meeting of the season is at 19.45 on Tues 2 September. You'll be made welcome at this, and at any of our meetings, so come along and check us out!
